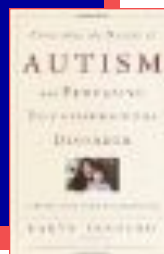

- *Autism now affects 1 in 88 children*
- *Boys are nearly five times more likely than girls to be diagnosed with Autism*
- *Four years, Five months is the average age for diagnosis*
